

## **Yes, It's Another Test for Graduate School Admission: The Personal Potential Index**

On Monday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, join the Office of Research and Graduate Studies for a brown bag lunch on Educational Testing Service's (ETS) new service, Personal Potential Index.

ETS's Personal Potential Index (PPI) is a new test designed to measure a student's potential success in graduate or professional school. Although the Office of Research and Graduate Studies does not require students to submit scores from the Personal Potential Index for general admission to KU, we may have the following situations occur:

- KU undergraduate or graduate students requesting professors to participate in the Personal Potential Index test;
- potential graduate students submitting scores for the Personal Potential Index to KU and their departments of study;
- KU departments interested in requiring students to submit PPI scores;
- Questions from students, professors, and staff about the purpose of PPI.

To help students, faculty, and staff with the PPI, we are offering information on this new testing service which could become more popular in the upcoming years:
